# 4.2 <u>OceanaGold update</u>

## Waihi Gold Mining Education Trust

Established in 1992, the Waihi Gold Mining Education Trust was initiated by the Waihi College Principal at the time, Harry Shepherd, and Waihi Gold.

Initially, the trust was set up as a fund of \$25,000 per year for five years 'to be used to improve the educational opportunities of the youth in Waihi', however, the trust was able to be continued past this initial timeframe. In 2005 the donation was increased to \$40,000 per annum and increased again in 2022 to \$58,000 per annum.

This year marked the 30th year of scholarships being presented to Waihi College students, with five students receiving \$4,000 each, and the remaining \$38,000 to be used by Waihi College to provide additional equipment and materials for the wider school.

To date, over a million dollars (\$1,091,396) has been contributed to Waihi College, with 170 individual scholarships provided.

We're proud to be able to continue supporting Waihi College and we wish all the recipients well intheir future endeavours.

#### **Jumpstart**

Jumpstart has just started up again for the year and Phil Salmon who is coordinating this programme would like to come and present to the Forum, could we please have some dates for upcoming meetings.

#### **Earthquakes and Cyclone Gabrielle**

The 5.1 magnitude earthquake located ~ 25km away in west Te Aroha triggered a TSF "Alert" level as defined in OG Waihi's TSF Operation Manual.

- Formal visual inspection undertaken
- Piezometers assessed
- Seepage flows monitored
- Engineering Geology consulted
- No issues identified

The OG meteorological station at Martha Pit recorded 1039mm of rain over 42 days. Over the same period last year, we received 160mm.

- Cyclone Hale 1 in 20 year event (282mm in 48 hours)
- Cyclone Gabrielle 1 in 10 year event (217mm in 24 hours)
   The TSFs were fully compliant.

Amenity Effects Payments (AEP)

For the July – December 2022 payment period, 334 properties qualified for an AEP Payment.

These payments totalled \$204,928.34

A breakdown of these payments are:

- 305 properties in the Project Martha area qualified for a payment, totalling \$197,678.34
- 29 properties in the Correnso Project area qualified for a payment, totalling \$7250.00

All qualifying residents have now been signed up and are awaiting payment. Since 2007 there have been 8,962 payments made, totalling \$5,786,138.87.
